From strength and conditioning to optional weekend training sessions, CCBA Players are offered a multitude of opportunities to expand their skillset and grow their basketball knowledge.

In addition to becoming a better basketball player, CCBA players reap the benefits of being a part of a community of boys specifically from Clay County, who are all working towards a goal, celebrating wins, and overcoming losses together.

Seasons: Winter 2024, Spring 2025, Summer 2025

Winter Season: Available to Elementary Only

Cost: \$300 for the season.

Practice times will be announced. Practice will be held on Sundays once a week. Teams will play 1 to 2 games per weekend, for 7 games, in addition to any county scrimmages available.

Spring 2025: Available to Elementary, Middle, High School

Cost: \$650 for the season.

Practice times will be announced. Practice will be held twice during the week. Days will be determined once teams have been formed. Teams will play 3 to 4 games per weekend, 2 weeks a month, for three months, totaling 6

tournaments. Spring has the biggest opportunity for game time as your player will be playing a total of 18-24 games and 24 practice sessions in a 3 month period.

Summer 2025: Available to Elementary, Middle, High School

Cost: \$450 for the season. Season Dates: June-July
